TRIAL UPDATE

43 PATIENTS WERE RECRUITED TO THE TRIAL IN JANUARY AND FEBRUARY!

729 patients have been recruited to the TracMan trial at the time of going to press!

TracMan is the **largest** tracheostomy timing trial in the world! (...but we need to get even bigger and are aiming for **1000 patients!**) **Recruitment to the trial will finish in just under 10 months on 31st December 2008.**

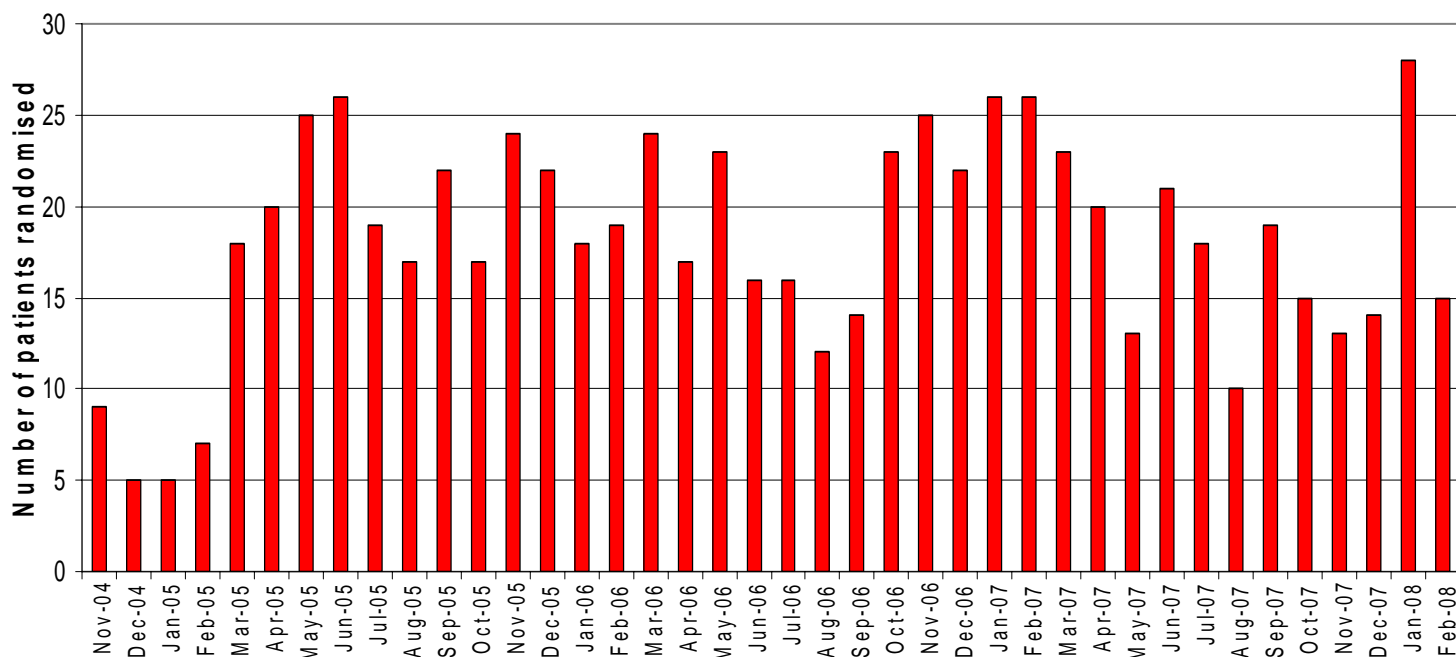


Thank you to everyone collaborating in the Trial for all the patients recruited so far. Remember recruitment is **still ongoing** and finishes this year on the 31st December.

WHEN SHOULD A PATIENT RECEIVE A TRACHEOSTOMY?
 The TracMan trial is the world's largest tracheostomy timing trial being conducted in the UK. It aims to determine whether placing a tracheostomy on days 1 - 4 of ICU admission reduces mortality (30 days after randomisation) compared to a tracheostomy placed on or after day 10.
 Please consider patients with respiratory failure and likely to require mechanical ventilation for 7 or more days for entry into the Trial.
